The difference in content is that "Get Tough" lacks the final chapter of "All-in Fighting", which covers the use of the bayonet. This book is an important cultural artifact, in that it encapsulates the teachings of Fairbairn as given to British forces. However, as a book on effective combatives, it falls flat.
