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Answers will vary: Shiloh was an incredibly bloody battle in the Civil War. Grant's armies were surprised by Confederate troops in the state of Tennessee on April 6th, 1862. Both sides fought well, but the Union eventually won - at a great cost. Almost 4,000 soldiers died and over 20,000 were injured.
