Simply put, critical thinking in nursing is a purposeful, logical process which results in powerful patient outcomes. "Critical thinking involves interpretation and analysis of the problem, reasoning to find a solution, applying, and finally evaluation of the outcomes," according to a 2010 study published in the Journal of Nursing Education.
