Thus, an easy way to remember the general format of a writing plan is to think of it as planning a 5 paragraph essayoutline where students would write an Introduction, Thesis, Body, and Conclusion. Then, fit a total of 5 paragraphs within the basic structure.

Each time you add a new point or subpoint, the word processor will add a new letter or number in the proper sequence.

Outlines are tools that are used by authors to chronologically arrange their written ideas about a central topic or thesis. Details in an outline are deductively written which means that it starts by mentioning the major topics, followed by subtopics and supporting details.

The standard order of an outline is: I. Roman numerals (I, II, III, IV, V, etc.) A. Capital letters (A, B, C, etc.) 1. Arabic numerals (1, 2, 3, etc.) a. Small letters (a, b, c, etc.) i. Small Roman numerals (i, ii, iii, iv, v, etc.)
