A landlord should always run a credit check to ensure the financial status of the entity and the individual prospective tenant. The credit check may reveal the tenant's prior rental history and other obligations. Moreover, if a landlord is using a guaranty for the lease, a landlord should also be concerned about the guarantor's credit as well.

Whenever required, the interest accrues to the tenant but the landlords are allowed to keep 1% of the security deposit every year as administration fee. This interest may be held by the landlord and returned with the rest of the security deposit at the termination of the lease, or applied to the rent or paid out to the tenant.
