For over 50 years researchers from Michigan Technological University have been studying the relationship between wolves and moose on Isle Royale, located in the middle of Lake Superior.

The original wolves arrived in the late 1940s, likely via an ice bridge connecting Isle Royale to the mainland. With warmer winters, there have not been ice bridges, so the chances of new wolves reaching the island on their own are slim. The National Park Service is considering its options.

Should We Let the Wolves of Isle Royale Disappear?

Historically neither moose nor wolves inhabited Isle Royale. Just prior to becoming a national park the largest mammals on Isle Royale were Canadian Lynx and the Boreal woodland caribou.
